Commissioner Roy Gold Installed As Broward League Of Cities' New President



Coral Springs City Commissioner Roy Gold is the new President of the Broward League of Cities.

Gold was installed as the incoming President for Broward League of Cities at a recent ceremony held at the Coral Springs Heron Bay Marriott.

In conjunction with the installation, Broward League of Cities also proclaimed May 7, as Roy Gold Day throughout the county.

"I couldn't have done what I have accomplished without the people I have worked with, the people that have mentored me, the people that I have served; and it's quite an honor," said Commissioner Gold.

Gold also served as the League's first Vice President on its 2009-2010 Board of Directors and as Vice Chairman of the League's Sustainability Committee. The non-profit Broward League of Cities represents and guides the county's 31 municipal governments.

Gold, elected to the Coral Springs City Commission in 2004, has been a longtime community and environmental activist. For the past 14 years, Gold has been the city's site leader for the annual Broward Waterway Cleanup.

"With the installment of Commissioner Gold, the appointment of our board of directors and the launch of our new website, we are poised to continue increasing awareness and providing resolutions to issues facing Broward County residents," said Rhonda Calhoun, executive director of the Broward League of Cities.

Secondly, sustainability; we all need to see the bigger picture and the long term consequences when we review issues that deal with our limited resources and needs that effect our communities," said Gold.
