Broward League of Cities Now Accepting Applications for Student Ambassador Program *Applications due by Nov. 18*

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. – After a successful inaugural year of the Student Ambassador program, the Broward League of Cities has announced it is now accepting applications to the program from high school juniors who plan to pursue a career in public administration, political science or other government-related fields. In order to qualify for the Student Ambassador program, students must be residents of Broward County and attend a Broward County public or charter school.

In an effort to support the future leaders of Broward County, the Broward League will provide four students with introductions into the world of public service. Student ambassadors are selected for a two-year term during which they attend Broward League of Cities general membership meetings, board of directors meetings and other functions pertaining to the operation of the League. Under the tutelage of the Broward League's Education Committee, students have the opportunity to meet with elected officials and learn the intricacies of governing at the municipal level.

"We are very proud of our current student ambassadors and look forward to welcoming four more students in the program who have the same passion for government," said Broward League of Cities President and Cooper City Mayor Debby Eisinger. "The League recognizes the importance of introducing students to the inner workings of municipal government, and we encourage parents, teachers and friends to urge students who show an interest in government to apply."

Four current student ambassadors, who started their terms last year and now are high school seniors, will continue in their roles and serve as mentors to the new ambassadors who are selected to enter the program this year.
