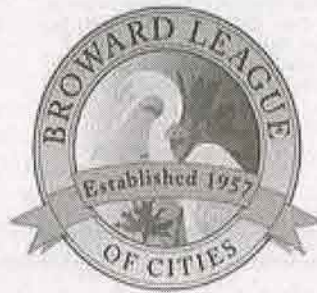

Broward League of Cities now accepting applications for Scholarship for Government Studies

FORT LAUDERDALE, FL – The Broward League of Cities announced it is now accepting applications for its annual Scholarship for Government Studies. Offered to four Broward County high school seniors who are residents of Broward County and attending Broward County public or charter schools, the scholarships provide financial support to students who plan to attend a college or university to pursue a major in public administration, political science or other government-related field.

The Broward League of Cities and its contributing Associate Members will award four outstanding students with \$1,000 each.

Applicants must demonstrate strong communication and leadership skills. The application must include one essay, one personal statement, two letters of recommendation and a

Applications are due by Feb. 10, 2012. To be considered, applicants must be available on the date scheduled for interviews, tentatively set for March 31, 2012.
