Student Ambassador Program Solidifies Cypress Bay Senior's Political Aspirations

REMBER THE NAME CHAD KLITZMAN. THE Cypress Bay senior is planning to pursue a career in politics, with the hope of one day serving in Congress.

He is well on his way. In addition to having spent the past two summers interning for U.S. Representative Ileana Ros-Lehtinen in Washington, D.C., Chad was also selected as one of the first participants in the Broward League of Cities' Student Ambassador Program. This program provides students interested in public affairs an opportunity to explore the intricacies of public service and municipal government.

As a student ambassador, Chad had the opportunity to attend monthly general membership and board of directors meetings. He says he enjoyed interacting with officials from all 31 municipalities in Broward County. "The most rewarding part of this entire experience has been the ability to speak openly with local officials and voice my opinions," shares Chad, noting that he used this opportunity to talk about an issue of importance to him, providing school funding for civic education. "If we want capable elected officials in the future, we need to engage students in the political process now."

In addition to providing a forum to interact with local leaders, Chad and the other student ambassadors also wrote monthly "My View" columns which were posted on the Broward League of Cities' website. "This blog was an opportunity to reflect on an experience I had as student ambassador over the past month or to talk about an issue

that was important to me," explains Chad.

High on his personal agenda is Kids Voting Broward. Chad serves as President of this organization which promotes civic awareness throughout Broward County schools, as well as sponsors voter registration drives in schools.

Chad made a presentation to the Broward League of Cities Board encouraging members to get children in their municipalities involved in Kids Voting Broward. "I was very impressed that he utilized his position as a Student Ambassador to lobby for one of his action items," notes Rhonda Calhoun, Executive Director of the Broward League of Cities.

She sees great potential in Chad as a future leader. "To think about this young man being involved in public service down the road is very inspiring," states Calhoun. "He is going into public service for all the right reasons, and that is very honorable."

Chad plans to study political science and public affairs next year in college. His ultimate goal is to serve in Congress. "If elected, my primary focus will be education. We need major reforms."

In the meantime, Chad will continue to serve as student ambassador through the end of the school year, mentoring the new class which starts this month. "My advice to them is to seek out every opportunity presented through the Broward League of Cities. It's been an incredible experience."

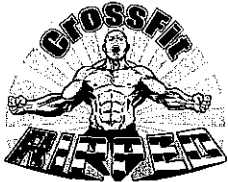
